We will improve the Troubled Families programme” • “We will establish a new £1 billion fund to help create more high quality, affordable childcare” • “Continue our efforts through the tax and benefits system to reduce poverty, including child poverty.” • “Legislate to allow parents to take extended leave for neonatal care” • Consider making flexible working the default for jobs 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • “We will pay childcare costs up front so that parents aren’t forced to turn down work or get into debt to pay for childcare” • Extend paid maternity leave to 12 months • Develop a National Strategy for Children “focusing on health, security, well-being and poverty” • “Scrap the benefit cap and the two child limit” • “Give all workers the right to flexible working” • Remove the Married Couple’s tax allowance 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pass law to allow the Church of England and Church in Wales to conduct same-sex marriages and introduce legal recognition of humanist marriages • Provide free childcare for all children with parents in work from nine months and for all children from two years, up to the time they start school. • Invest £1 billion in Children’s Centres • Remove the two child limit and the benefits cap • Scrap the Marriage Tax Allowance
